The TUS study will focus on the culture and traditions of the band with the goal of documenting the knowledge, activities, and values of community members in preparation for the proposed BC Hydro West Kelowna Transmission Project.

The Outreach Worker West will provide administrative support to ASETS West Program Manager, when requested, of the ASETS West Aboriginal Skills Employment and Training Strategy. This is a full-time term position starting on April 3rd, 2018 and ending March 29th, 2019.

Relevant Knowledge and Abilities

- Prepare cheque requisitions, applications, and administer contracts
- Monitor and prepare contracts for payment and processing
- Facilitate individual and group sessions to First Nations bands, community organizations, Employers, and Economic Development Corporations on ASETS programs and funding policies
