Marriage or Divorce Certificate

If applying for a minor 15 years of age or under

An application must be accompanied by:

Parent/Legal Guardian – one piece of primary ID or two pieces of secondary ID, one must have a digitized photo.

If applicable, a copy of the legal guardianship orders naming the guardian, if the legal guardian is applying on behalf of the child.

Child – one piece of ID from either category




- WE will:


